



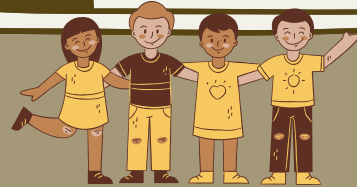
In Preparing Children for the Real World
